#### **Director's Notes**

In late Winter 2019, Kim Andrews, a gifted pianist and amazing person, suggested we do this play. I read it and it hit me like a speeding train. We all know what happened next. Things happened. To all of us on the earth. Which changed everything.

But here we are at last. This is often referred to as a morality play. It isn't. It is a mirror, and a painful one. It's about the abuse of power, the abuse and objectification of women and all those at the edge of our society, the ones we don't see or don't want to see. It's about what we think and say and do (or don't do) and the ripples those things cause. And how those ripples become waves.

The play was set in 1912, written in 1946, but it has hardly aged a day. To paraphrase a sign I saw at a recent gathering promoting the rights of women, "I can't believe we still have to argue about this s\_\_t!" But we do. We must. We must also take the leap to open our eyes and hearts.

I am so very grateful to this gifted and generous cast. They have given so much to this production. It has been a great privilege to work with such an amazing group of actors and truly incredible people.

### Biographies

Aaron Elmore (Inspector Goole) is, with Katie Jensen, co-founder and co-artistic director of Theatre in the Rough. He wrote and directed *Running with Pretty Sharp Things* for TR's 25th year. Acting credits include the H in *The Arsonists* (Perseverance Theatre), the title role of *Don Giovanni* (Opera To Go) as well as many TR productions including the title role in *Cyrano de Bergerac*, Fluelen in *Henry V*, and Frank in 84 *Charing Cross Road*.
